There have been 20 projects supported during this fiscal year. We must regret the impossibility of developing a project in Nigeria, specifically in Aondona. The constant attacks by the Fulanis made investment in the area unviable.

The year 2025 has left us with a great response from volunteers. We have initiated training for the 2026 Experience in Bolivia and the volunteer Experience of Vélez Rubio. We are trying to resume annual group experiences both inside and outside of Spain.

We enter with enthusiasm into a year marked by the 25th anniversary of our NGO. We do not want to end without encouraging you to participate in the events commemorating this anniversary.

We can only invite you to learn in greater detail about everything accomplished this year through the pages of this Report.

## WHO ARE WE?

KORIMA CLARETIANAS is a national NGO for Development, established in Carcaixent (Valencia) on January 10, 2002, and linked to the Congregation of Religious of Mary Immaculate Claretian Missionaries - Europe Province. Its fundamental objectives are the promotion of development and the raising of awareness and education in solidarity, both in Spain and in Third World countries, through support for local projects.

Since its inception, KORIMA has been registered with the Spanish Agency for International Development Cooperation (AECID). It is also registered in the Registry of International Development Cooperation Agents of the Valencian Community, in the Registry of Non-Governmental Organizations of the Autonomous Community of Extremadura, in the Registry of NGOs of the Community of Andalusia, in the Registry of Associations of Cartagena, and the Registry of Associations of Carcaixent.

- 1º Raise awareness and educate in solidarity.
- 2º Live it with the most disadvantaged, promoting their development.
- 3º Motivate the living of human values, based on the Gospel, as an alternative lifestyle in our society.
- 4º Offer channels for cooperation through missionary groups.
- 5º Identify, formulate, manage, monitor, and evaluate development cooperation and social awareness projects.

## WHAT DO WE DO?

### PROJECTS

In development cooperation, we have been able to support 20 cooperation and welfare projects. They are listed below, grouped by continents.

#### ASIA

During the 2024-2025 academic year, the solidarity project supported by the Claretian schools is **\*\*LEAVE NO ONE BEHIND\*\*** (\*QUE NADIE SE QUEDE ATRÁS\*). This project grouped into one the school reinforcement and welfare programs that the Claretian Missionaries carry out in the countries that form the South Asia Organism: India and Sri Lanka. The aid sent amounted to 20,130 euros.

#### SCHOOL REINFORCEMENT PROJECT-SOUTH ASIA



A project aimed at facilitating learning for low-income children so that their schooling progress is not affected by a lack of means.

#### AID TO FAMILIES IN SRI LANKA (Mallavi y Kotapitiya) AND INDIA (Erachakulam)

The project aims to help families especially hit by the economic crisis and without financial income, elderly people, or sick individuals.



#### STUDY SUPPORT IN SRI LANKA



The Claretian Missionaries try to encourage the education of girls and young women by providing housing and study materials to low-income adolescents in order to prevent school dropout.



#### THREE WHEELS SRI LANKA

A project supporting the social pastoral work of the Kottapitiya community. Traveling to bring aid to families in need is fundamental to carrying out the mission. The aid sent is 3,400 euros.



#### SEWING WORKSHOPS TIMOR

A labor insertion project for vulnerable people, which tries to train them in a profession such as sewing and facilitate obtaining income for their families. The amount of aid stands at 5,017



## AMÉRICA

### PROJECT "WITHOUT PAPERS I AM NOBODY" (\*SIN PAPELES NO SOY NADIE\*) DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Through this project, the processing of identity documents for Haitian families in Batey Bienvenido has been managed, with everything this process entails at a bureaucratic and legal level, in order to legalize the situation in which these families find themselves. Sent aid: 18,000 euros.



### TEACHER MOTHERS PROJECT (\*MADRES MAESTRAS\*)

The training program for Teacher Mothers qualifies them for the management of Kindergartens. Sent aid: 6,000 euros.

### LITTLE SCHOOL PROJECT (\*ESCUELITA\*) DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

El proyecto ayuda a los niños y niñas que no pueden acceder a la escuela por falta de documentación a obtener un nivel básico de conocimientos en lengua, matemáticas... para que puedan inscribirse a la escuela pública en las mejores condiciones posibles. Ayuda: 2958 euros.



### FOOD EMERGENCY SANTIAGO DE CUBA AND SOCIAL SOUP KITCHEN GUANTÁNAMO

Projects that try to alleviate the food shortage suffered by the elderly and the most vulnerable on the island, creating a social soup kitchen and delivering food. In addition, the budget has been expanded as a humanitarian emergency due to the food shortage difficulties Cuba is experiencing. The aid is 13,100 euros.

### "PUT YOURSELF IN MY SHOES" (\*PONTE EN MIS ZAPATOS\*) BOLIVIA

It aims for the comprehensive development of adolescents in Guayaramerín through a space for listening, education, training, and prevention that promotes accompaniment in the process of their developmental stage. The collection amounted to 10,500 euros.

### "MANOS AMIGAS" MEDICAL CLINIC HONDURAS

The clinic serves an average of 100 to 120 people per month, especially children, youth, adults, and senior citizens. It also provides a pharmacy service. The aid received is 6,500 euros.



## ÁFRICA

### MARÍA INMACULADA MEDICALIZED CENTER PROJECT IN TYO, CAMEROON

The hospital expands its portfolio of services in the areas of stomatology, clinical analysis, and ophthalmology. It is also being equipped with renewed furniture. Amount sent: 40,000 euros.



### CHILDHOOD CONGO PROJECT

Sponsorship campaign for children, adolescents, and youth in the D.R. Congo, as well as a nutritional campaign for all sectors of the population. Sent aid: 28,500 €.

### NUTRITIONAL CENTERS D.R. CONGO

The main objective is to provide minors with a daily meal in order to alleviate the nutritional needs present in the children of the served populations. The Claretian Missionaries working in Congo maintain children's centers in Matondo (Isingu) and Mawete (Pay-Kongila). Sent aid: 7,000 €.

### TRAINING AND NUTRITION MADAGASCAR



It is an informal schooling project for more than 70 children, as well as nutritional support for their development. The project amount stands at 13,600 €.

### DESERT FLOWERS NIGERIA (\*FLORES DEL DESIERTO\*)

A project that wants to boost and encourage the education of young Nigerian women, sponsoring their maintenance or studies. It seeks to avoid school dropout among girls and their marriage at very early ages. Aid: 3,200 €.



### MAWETE D. R. CONGO



After years in operation, the Mawete Center needed multiple repairs. The Restoy Foundation subsidized the works with 5,000 euros and the rest was contributed by the generosity of various donors. Sent aid: 6,500 euros.

### WOMEN BENIN PROJECT

The project basically consists of the advancement of women in northern Benin for the sake of justice and due to the positive effects on their sons and daughters. Sent aid: 6,000 euros.



## EUROPA

### NAZARET PROJECT SPAIN

The project responds to the needs of migrant families in situations of extreme vulnerability. It tries to incorporate them into the host society by accompanying them in their initial procedures and offering to cover basic needs to favor their integration into our society in a dignified manner. Aid: 9,400 euros.

### "DONATE TIME, DONATE LIFE" (\*DONA TIEMPO, DONA VIDA\*) PROJECT SPAIN

A project subsidized by the MIA of Carcaixent that tries to encourage voluntary action. The project has two objectives: to create social awareness of co-responsibility with the most disadvantaged people and to encourage the involvement of youth in school reinforcement activities. Cost of the project: 2,950 €.

## EMERGENCIES

The DANA emergency continued with the collaboration of PROCLADE BÉTICA. The Parish Caritas (\*Cáritas Parroquiales\*) that have been our counterparts have continued their work in the reconstruction phase. We expanded aid to the Parish Caritas San José de Calasanz of Algemesí.



The year ended with the emergency of the Badulla LANDSLIDE and Cyclone Ditwah. Sri Lanka suffered major floods, landslides, and countless material losses. The Claretian Missionaries of South Asia requested to manage the emergency. This emergency has been divided into two phases:

- Sending money for basic necessity goods, which they distributed in collaboration with the CMF Claretian Missionaries.
- Reconstruction Phase: Aid that enabled facilitating the rehabilitation and reconstruction of 7 homes.

## SPONSORSHIPS (\*APADRINAMIENTOS\*)

The countries where we have sponsored 325 children and youth are: Honduras and the Democratic Republic of the Congo.



The schools of the Claretian Missionaries join the sponsorship program. Thus, the schools of Carcaixent, Zafra, and Trepmp jointly sponsor boys and girls from Congo and Honduras. The cost of sponsorship is 240 euros annually, with the aid normally being sent semi-annually to the mission sites.



## VOLUNTEERING

### VOLUNTEERING IN SPAIN

The main activities carried out by our volunteers have been: school reinforcement, and Spanish and Valencian classes for immigrants. The Delegation of Vélez is going to be the location chosen for the youth volunteer experience during Holy Week. On October 9, we met with local entities to coordinate this volunteering activity.



### MISSIONARY EXPERIENCE TRAINING BOLIVIA

Following the call in October, we initiated training with future volunteers. It takes place monthly, in collaboration with the Province of the Claretian Missionaries of Latin America.

## AWARENESS AND EDUCATION FOR DEVELOPMENT

The Missionary Group regularly continues its activities every Friday during the school year. It currently has more than 30 children. The children learn what it means to be a missionary, are brought closer to realities different from those they live day-to-day, and learn about the different missions carried out around the world by the Claretian Missionaries.



Awareness campaigns aim to shed light on special situations requiring aid, such as natural disasters, famines, and wars. This year, different emergencies have been worked on and projects have been publicized, but we are especially satisfied to join the Legislative Popular Initiative **"SOMOS ESENCIALES"** ("We Are Essential"), an initiative that has successfully brought 500,000 signatures to Congress.



## COMMUNICATION AND PUBLICATIONS

KORIMA uses social networks as the primary means to maintain communication with members and collaborators. Also as a medium used for awareness and information campaigns.

We post on the website all the news and materials we receive, both regarding our own activities and campaigns in which we participate. We edited the 2024 activity report.

We have signed a collaboration agreement with the different entities during the year 2025 to develop activities during the 2026 fiscal year. We took the opportunity to visit the Taller de la Inmaculada and see the work of the volunteers.
